A couple of changes to be aware of regarding FITA Field rounds.

Advice from ArcheryNSW Recorder

FITA Arrowheads

Cadets shooting FITA Field Rounds over the shorter Rounds (Blue Pegs for Compound and Recurve and Yellow Pegs for Barebow Recurve) are **NOT** able to claim the existing FITA arrowheads.

Claims made to FITA for some high level Arrowheads are apparently to be declined, but an indication was given that consideration is being made about introducing "Cadet Arrowheads" following the successful Cadet FITA Stars (for the shorter target rounds) and Cadet Target Awards (for 60m 72 arrow rounds or half FITAs over the shorter distances).

I've no idea of the timing of these new Arrowheads. I'm also not aware if backdated claims will be allowed as this has not been the case in the past. However all possible claims have been sent to Archery Australia to claim/issue awards if FITA later introduces the Cadet Arrowheads and approves backdating.

In the meantime if Cadets wish to claim arrowheads they will need to shoot the Junior/Open rounds for their bow type.

AA FITA Field Records

AA Records for the shorter rounds will be claimable for rounds shot from January 1 2007. The current records will remain until the listed record until broken.

Please be aware that the Archery Australia Board has approved a Records Committee motion to change the requirements for the record which currently required a combined score for a 24 marked and a 24 Unmarked FITA Round. As from January 1 2007 this record will simply require 2 x 24 Target FITA Field Rounds shot in Tournament/s on the same or consecutive days.

The table below indicates the Pegs that will now be shot at National Championships, and for classification purposes, these are the pegs for Fita Field Rounds.

NEWS: NEW CLUB RECORDS up for grabs!!— commencing immediately the club will be backdating from the 1st January 2007 records for 48T Fita Field (marked).



As per the previous note - In the past the club has only kept records for 48T Fita Field (24Targets Marked & 24Targets Unmarked), however, due to changes by Archery Australia & ArcheryNSW, the club will now keep records for the 48T Fita Field (24T Marked/24T Unmarked) and the 48T Fita Field (2x24T Marked rounds), these will be backdated to 1st January 2007.

LONG SYDNEY: 36 arrows @ 90/70/60/50 (122cm face)

LONG BRISBANE: 30 arrows @ 90/70 (122cm face & 60*/50* (80cmface)

*Special note: Master Bowmen & Grand Master Ratings will apply when shooting both the Long Sydney and/or Long Brisbane rounds.

FITA 70m RANKING ROUND: 2 x 36 arrows @ 70m 122cm face.

VICTORIA – 90 arrows @ 70m 122cm face.

GRANGE (previously known as the WINNELLIE) – 90 arrows @ 60m 122cm face (this is a new round acknowledged by Archery Australia)

Note: In the past the Victoria/Winnellie records were eligible for AdBow/Kidbow members only, but now full records will now be granted.

I'm having a real good time like I am."

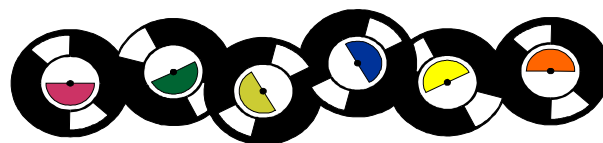

At the 2007 National Championships – NSW members did very well in all forms of competition, however, some of our club members also came away with a stack of medals.

Aimee Deaves – Bronze in the Open Target Event, Silver in the Field Event, and GOLD in the Clout Event.

NSW won both the Open Teams Recurve event scoring 17918 points with WA scoring 12064 points –



congratulations to Aimee & James Johnstone who were part of this team. Our Compound Team scored 19886 with our nearest rival being Victoria – scoring 19580

Cain Beckett won Gold in the Disability National Target Championships for Male Recurve category.

Scott Wandl won Silver in the Cadet Boy Recurve Barebow Divn for Clout and was a member of the Junior Recurve Team, and Tom Benstead secured silver in the Intermediate Boy Compound category,

NSW won the Junior Recurve Team event with a score of 11953 beating off WA with a score of 11559. NSW was just pipped in the Compound Teams event by SA who scored 12968 to NSW final total of 12742.
