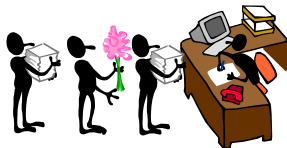

At the ACT Championships on 24th January: Jaime / Jack & Michael went down and competed in the open division shooting a Long Fita 90/70/50*/30* Jaime scoring 1276 (17th) Jack 1247 (26th), and Michael scoring 1199 (30th). Aimee came (4th) scoring 1183, I competed in the Mens Compound Master Divn and came 1st with a score of 1253 – my first Master Bowmen for 2009 – Yippee!!!

In the Matchplay – Aimee came away with the Bronze medal, Jaime finished (15th), Jack (25th), Michael (27th), with me finishing (28th). Some of the matchplay events were very exciting, with Jaime scoring 112 points in one of his matches, and only being defeated by Pat Couglan who shot 118, excellent experience for both Jaime & Jack in their lead up to the Junior World Championships in July.

All the parents worked together well to create the best conditions for our young archers, helping each other with transport etc. Steve Salmon took over the job of Team Captain, and delivered regular team talks, making sure that the boys knew what they were doing.

Diamond Valley Archers ran a very good tournament with a couple of good fun shoots. The Match play day was exciting, with everyone cheering on our team.

How well do you know Tournament & Shooting Rules - YOU BE THE JUDGE what would you do?

December question:

At an indoor tournament you are called to judge the following situation.

The archer has shot four arrows to a three spot target; an 8 in the upper face, a 10 in the middle face, a 9 in the bottom face and an arrow that bounced out onto the floor.

The archer explains that his first arrow bounced out from the top face.

There are unmarked holes – a five on the top face and a one on the bottom face.

What does the archer score?

Answer to Question raised in December edition is:

The archer scores 9,5,M.

Why:

The bouncer scores as a five in the top target (benefit of the doubt).

So the archer has shot 10,9,8,5.

The upper face has two arrows (an eight and a five) – scores as a five, and a miss,

Four arrows shot (10,9,5,M) so highest value dropped, therefore 9,5,M.

Special notes: New Rounds introduced for 2009 – Yippee.

Each year we try and introduce a couple of new rounds, so that we can give a lot more variety to our members. This year records are up for grabs for the following:

Harbour Round – 90 arrows @ 90m 122cm face (*I wanted to make it a 40cm face but you know.....*)

We trialed last month the Top Half of our Fita Rounds (ie Wollongong you all know 36 arrows @ 90/70m – Townsville 36 arrows @ 70/60m), well now we have 3 more new ones.

Bothwell: 36 arrows @ 60m & 50m (Top half of a Fremantle).

Yass: 36 arrows @ 55m & 45m (Top half of an Intermediate).

Goulburn: 36 arrows @ 40m & 35m (Top half of a Horsham).

This would also allow records to be claimed for the round as well as the 36 bracket distance, and by introducing the above we allow members who wish to shoot longer than the round scheduled on the day to continue shooting.

Note: It must be remember though that you cannot claim a record for a round within a round, therefore if you shoot say a Wollongong, and then decided to go on and shoot the bottom half, then you have effectively shot a Long Fita.

Access Numbers: OK now I'm beginning to sound like a broken record. It is important that members place their access number on their score sheets, and not their ArcheryNSW Number. This is for ease in recording your scores at the club. If you cannot remember your number then there is a full listing kept down the club on the notice board. When you are using the score sheet, where it has Comp Number, you can place your **Access Number** here when shooting at the club.

Rounds & Distances: I have also had to discard several score sheets over the last month due to being incomplete and/or chase up members to find out what they shot. Members must remember that the score sheets used by the club, are the ones that have been set down by Archery Australia and by filling these in correctly, you are well on your way to being able to fill them out properly when you attend a shoot away from the club, after all what you record on them is what places you in tournaments. Please try and advise your poor wee recorded what rounds / distances & face sizes you use when shooting please.
